Project Examples

Bullring, Birmingham (The Birmingham Alliance) - CgMs managed a complex programme of archaeological evaluations and mitigation by excavation, including clearance of St. Martin's burial ground. Working closely with demolition, construction and landscaping teams, CgMs ensured that archaeology did not impact on Bullring's completion and launch in September 2003.

Summer Row, Wolverhampton (MultiDevelopment UK Ltd) - CgMs is advising on archaeology and historic buildings issues for this innovative mixed use regeneration scheme. We are working closely with Gardiner & Theobald and Carillion to deliver a phased programme of desk-based assessment, evaluation and mitigation excavation for this landmark development.

Worcester City Campus (University of Worcester) - CgMs is managing the archaeological mitigation for the impact of developing this key site. A phased programme of evaluation has been carried out and, following negotiation with the City Council, the scope of mitigation has been agreed. The first phase of this has been implemented and new student accommodation was delivered for 2009. Recording of listed buildings and advice on built heritage issues forms an integral part of CgMs' role.

Waitrose, Droitwich (John Lewis Partnership) - CgMs secured Scheduled Monument Consent and planning consent for construction of this store, following complex negotiations with English Heritage, Wychavon District Council and Worcestershire County Council to achieve a mutually acceptable mitigation scheme.

Carrs Lane, Birmingham (Realis Estates) - CgMs has managed the mitigation excavation and reporting ahead of this mixed-use development in the City Centre.

Marsh Lane, Solihull (Marie Curie Cancer Care) - Rapid preparation of a desk-based assessment ensured that the risk of archaeology to this site's development was eliminated and planning consent was granted with no requirement for further archaeological investigation.

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
