



## Tom Rumley

Tom has worked for both private consultants and a building firm on a range of historic buildings, which has provided an understanding of the sector from different stakeholder perspectives. Tom possesses excellent research skills and has experience in producing a range of built heritage appraisals.

### Experience

During Tom's undergraduate degree he completed an 18-month long work placement with a multi-disciplined built environment consultancy. In this role he took sole contract administrative responsibility of several refurbishment projects for the London Fire & Emergency Planning Authority (LFEPA), assisted on others and with a large-scale roof-replacement scheme on a post-1945 listed London secondary school. The latter project introduced Tom to post-war educational architecture, an area he expanded on during his undergraduate and postgraduate dissertations.

Tom obtained an MSc in the Conservation of Historic Buildings at the University of Bath. Following that he worked as a building technician at an established Norfolk building firm, overseeing the management of building projects to a variety of listed buildings including several churches.

Tom joined RPS CgMs at the beginning of 2015 and has contributed to and completed built heritage statements for residential developments within the setting of numerous heritage assets and produced built heritage assessments for a range of projects involving agricultural and industrial buildings.

### Key Projects

#### **Market Place, Newark-on-Trent**

Undertook research and assisted with producing built heritage statement to convert a vacant Grade II listed retail shop into a new business venture.

#### **Lund Hill, Royston**

Produced a built heritage assessment for an industrial structure and provided a successful appraisal arguing that it would not be considered a potential listing candidate, which contributed towards securing its demolition.

#### **Hawksworth Road, Screveton**

Produced a built heritage briefing note to support a successful planning application for a small residential development located close to a Grade II listed farmhouse, farm buildings and several non-designated heritage assets.
