CgMs' Archaeology and Historic Building Teams prepared archaeological, built heritage and townscape chapters for an Environmental Statement for the redevelopment of the Marlowe Theatre, Canterbury. The site is owned by Canterbury City Council and the EIA was project managed by Drivers Jonas LLP.

Proposals included the demolition of the majority of the existing structure, just retaining its flytower. The building will be replaced with a

significantly larger state of the art theatre building, with improved facilities for performers and audience along with education facilities.

CgMs addressed a raft of heritage considerations including the impact upon the World Heritage Site of Canterbury Christchurch Cathedral, St Augustine's Abbey and St Martin's Church, and the impact upon the Blackfriars Scheduled Ancient Monument which the site felly wholly within. The site was also located within the Canterbury City Conservation Area and had some 920 listed buildings located within a 2km radius of the site.

The City Council wished to create a new cultural flagship landmark for the city. The scheme was granted in August 2008 and CgMs continue to advice the City Council on archaeology and built heritage issues.
